Our year 6 children were recently asked to create a prayer station to be displayed in Canterbury Cathedral. They went on a visit this week to see their prayer station display and Evie, Charlotte and George have written a report to share with you all:

On Tuesday 7th November Badgers Class were invited to a special event at Canterbury Cathedral. The event was organised by the Diocese of Canterbury who invited a number of schools from across Kent.

During the day we took part in activities based around the theme of 'senses'. All The children visited five prayer stations and took part in learning experiences such as exploring Bible stories, linked to a specific sense; touring the Cathedral and learning about the significance of various parts of the building; singing songs based on well-known Bible stories and viewing the architecture of the cathedral in order to inspire some clay pot decorating.

The day ended with all the schools coming together to worship in prayer and song. This was led by some Year 6 children from another school. Our school took part in a procession through the Cathedral, sang songs like "I've got Peace like a River" and had time for quiet reflection.

It was an interesting and spiritual day!

Lunchtime changes – Pupil Voice has spoken!
