Hedgehogs Class

This term our topic is "Who Lives in a Rockpool?" We will be using books based on the seaside and the sea for our Literacy work. These will include The Rainbow Fish, Barry the Fish with Fingers and The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch. In Maths, we will be using our place value knowledge to solve more difficult problems, adding and subtracting the number of objects in different groups and looking at time. Our Science learning is going to look at Plants – we will be planting our own seeds and seeing how well they grow in different conditions.

In RE, we will be looking back at some of the different stories we have learnt about this year and using them to create a timeline of Christianity. PE will focus on athletics in preparation for Sports Day in July.

Foxes will continue to discover about the Anglo Saxon invasion of Britain. This will include building an Anglo Saxon settlement, building the long boat of Sutton Hoo and designing letters of the alphabet found in the manuscripts of that time. They will be putting their drama skills to practise by reading, acting and writing playscripts about the Anglo Saxon story of Beowulf.



Maths this term will include developing properties of shapes by identifying different angles and measuring angles using a protractor. They will then progress onto measuring perimeter and area of shapes reliably.
