We would like to congratulate Mrs Coleman and her family who are expecting a baby in October. Mrs Coleman will be leaving for maternity leave at October half term and will hopefully be returning after the May half term in 2019.

Parking

Please can all parents/guardians refrain from parking outside the church and cottage opposite the school. This area should be kept clear for access to the churchyard via the gate and to the cottage and for cars entering and exiting the car park. We had an instance recently whereby a delivery van was unable to park safely to make a delivery to the school as there were parked cars outside of the empty car park which occupied the only safe parking spaces available for vehicles unable to pass under the height restriction of the car park. This request is being made to ensure your children have safe crossing over what can be a very busy road without having to negotiate careless parking. This is also summarised in the Highway Code as follows, which means it can be enforced by the police and council officers:

Extract of Rule 243 – DO NOT stop or park:

- Near a school entrance
- Opposite or within 10 metres (32feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- In front of an entrance to a property
- On a bend

It is also requested that cars do not stop directly outside the school to let children out as this would encourage other traffic to pass on the opposite side of the road, which simply can not be tolerated while the school crossing is in use. Please do not other pedestrians in danger by forcing other vehicles to pass your or by restricting the view of other drivers.
