For Christians the greatest of all acts of worship is simply called 'thanksgiving' - Eucharistic in Greek - thanksgiving for the death and resurrection of God's Son and the way of forgiveness that is opened up. Millions of Christians will go to a Communion Service (Eucharist) every Sunday, in fact some will want to go every day because the service is so important to them. For most Christians, the Communion Service is an important moment when they say thank you to God. To show how important it was to one Christian, share the story of Buzz Aldrin, the second man on the moon. He wanted to express his faith and give thanks to God by taking Holy Communion on the moon!
